I am live at city hall where earlier today the city council voted to run the city of Syracuse Bike-share program for a two-year period.

The program will be run through a company called "Gotcha". Bike sharing allows people to rent bikes throughout the city and return them to any Gotcha bike station.

There will also be a three wheeled bike, allowing for people with disabilities to use them.

A local bike enthusiast and Syracuse resident, Alexander Byrd Green has been riding his bike around the city for years and says that if the bike share was easily accessible and reasonably prices, many people would use it (0:30)

Officials did not say exactly when the bike-share will be implemented but there is word they'll be installed around late summer or early in the fall.
